What is discovery and metadata?

Discovery and metadata is the area of librarianship that makes things findable. Sometimes referred to as "data about data," metadata is structured descriptive information about a particular resource, coded in a machine readable format and output in a user-friendly display. This makes both digital and traditional print collections discoverable and helps to keep the library collections organized and authoritative. In DMS, we primarily use MARC and Dublin Core metadata to create and maintain bibliographic records of our library materials, so while we may seem arcane and behind the scenes, we make Tech Services a Public Service.



Bottom line: It's what makes library materials searchable.
